

**MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
OF
BOARD OF EDUCATION, SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 172
ADAMS COUNTY, ILLINOIS
HELD ON MAY 23, 2018 – 6:00 P.M.**

Meeting Convened

The Board of Education of School District No. 172, Adams County, Illinois, met in regular session on May 23, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. in the Board of Education Office, Room 214, 1416 Maine Street, Quincy, Illinois, in said school district.

Roll Call

The meeting was called to order by President Ali, who directed the secretary to call the roll. On the call of the roll, the following members were present and answered to their names: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup and Whitfield; and the following members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared a quorum was present.

Moment of Silence

President Ali declared a moment of silence and reflection.

Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by President Ali.

Focus on Students – Good Things Going On!

Jump Rope for Heart Recognition – Catherine Henebry, Youth Marketing Director for the American Heart Association, presented awards to Dewey and Baldwin School for their participation in Jump Rope for Heart.

Good News Report - Public Information Officer Raquel Piazza reported on last day activities at the schools.

QJHS PTA – Dan Sparrow, QJHS Principal, reported on PTA activities including an assembly on bullying, library books for classrooms, Haunted Hallways fundraiser, new classroom projectors, holiday treats and appreciation lunch for staff.

QHS PTA – A summary of 2017-18 PTA activities at Senior High was provided to Board members. Fundraising efforts focused on Teacher Technology Grants. The PTA helped with district-wide efforts to lower student absentee rates by increasing the number of adult mentors available to QHS students. PTA also serves as a resource for students, assisting various student groups with bake sales and donations to advocate for students and families.

Questions and Comments

President Ali opened the meeting to questions and comments to members of the Board, by members of the public and employees of the district, in compliance with state statutes.

Jeff Kerkhoff distributed some information and commented on the ninth amendment to the United States Constitution and history textbook errors. He also commented on the recent Washington School tour.

Consent Agenda

It was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member Bailey to approve the following items on the Consent Agenda:

- b. Minutes –April 25 and May 16, 2018*

- d. Acknowledge receipt of the Freedom of Information Log: April 21 – May 18, 2018*

On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Reports of the Superintendent

- 1. Leadership Academy.** Mr. Timothy Southers presented information on a Leadership Academy proposal for teens and young adults. The trained leaders would serve as counselors for a camp for children in grades kindergarten through 8th grade. The leaders would be paid above minimum wage for a summer job opportunity. The location for the training and camp would be at Lincoln-Douglas School at no cost to the District. Board members were supportive of the program.
- 2. May 31 Celebration.** Superintendent Webb said the last day celebration for staff will be held at 8:30 a.m. at Quincy Junior High Morrison Theater. The event will include highlights from the year for each location, recognition of retirees and some special awards will be presented.
- 3. K-5 Transition.** Carol Frericks, Student Services Director, presented an update on the K-5 transition plan. Each K-5 learning community will have one 4th grade and one 5th grade accelerated class. Information has been provided to parents through the April K-5 Newsletter. These classes will utilize the current approach to accelerated learning by differentiating instruction. The K-5 music learning opportunities have been finalized. Each K-5 will have general music classes for all students. Fourth and fifth grade students will continue to have the opportunity to participate in instrumental music. The all-district instrumental band and orchestra for second-year students will meet weekly on Wednesdays after school. Participating students will be transported to a central location on Wednesday but parents/guardians must provide transportation home. There have been team building opportunities as educators develop a vision for their new learning communities and helped to create a Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) behavior matrix to be used in all K-5 buildings. More team building is scheduled in August. The master schedule has been completed to offer students continuity and consistency among all five schools. Instructional materials, technology, and new and refurbished furniture is being moved in. Parents have been encouraged to register their child online during spring registration in order to determine bus service needs and develop routes.
- 4. Child Care.** Ryan Whicker, Chief of Business Operations, reported that before and after school child care will be offered at all K-5 learning communities. There is an average of 30 students currently signed up for next year at each site.
- 5. Valedictorian Selection.** Superintendent Webb said he would like the Curriculum Committee and Senior High leadership to look at the process for valedictorian selection at QHS for the upcoming school year.
- 6. Blue Devil Coin Presentation.** This is the last Board meeting coverage with Patrick Doss of WGEM News. Superintendent Webb said that Patrick's family roots in education are pulling him back to his home in Indiana where he and his wife will continue their careers in education together. Patrick has spent many hours over the course of his time at WGEM on many topics for the benefit of our community. Mr. Webb said Patrick has always been kind, fair, and a pleasure to work with. He presented a Blue Devil Coin to Patrick as a token of appreciation for his work with the District and wished him the best

in his new endeavors in the field of education.

7. **School Based Health Care.** Member Troup reported on the School Based Health Care Advisory Committee meeting held May 18, 2018. An update was presented on the families who are part of the hot spotting pilot. There are now 10 families included. Considerable progress has been made with these families. Additional staff and more funding is needed to reach more families. The group is working on potential grants and donations.

Building Committee

The Building Committee report was presented by Co-Chair Troup. An update on building projects was presented. The committee reviewed the 10-Year Health Life Safety surveys, a recommendation to resurface the Blue Devil Gym floor, and improve sound baffles at Lincoln-Douglas and remaining new schools.

10-Year Health Life Safety Survey

It was recommended by the Building Committee and moved by Member Troup to approve the 10-Year Health Life Safety Surveys as presented. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Resurface Blue Devil Gym

It was recommended by the Building Committee and moved by Member Troup to approve resurfacing the Blue Devil Gym at a cost of \$28,000 (\$5,000 to be donated by the Shootout Committee). On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Curriculum Committee

The Curriculum Committee report was presented by Chairperson Bailey. The committee heard an update on accelerated learning and music learning opportunities in the new K-5 Learning Communities. The committee learned that an application has been submitted to renew the Truancy Alternative and Optional Education Program (TAOEP) Grant.

Finance Committee

Co-Chairperson Nichols presented the Finance Committee report. The committee reviewed the financial reports and check register. The amended 2017-18 District and Special Education Association Budgets were presented. Information was provided on the annual working cash abatement and the issuance of the last general obligation school bonds for the building project. The committee heard a presentation from Enterprise Fleet Management on leasing district vehicles and reviewed a recommendation on fuel bids. An escalating fuel bid price was recommended. After some discussion, the Board tabled action on the fuel bids.

Policy Committee

Chairperson Bailey presented the Policy Committee report. The committee reviewed the 2018-2019 handbooks and updated the acceptable use procedure. Revised Policy 6:235 – Access to Electronic networks was also reviewed and will be laid on the table until the next Board meeting.

2018-2019 Handbooks

It was recommended by the Policy Committee and moved by Member Bailey to approve the 2018-2019 School Handbooks. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Discipline Committee

The Discipline Committee did not meet in May.

Human Relations Committee

The Human Relations Committee did not meet in May.

Attendance Drawing

An employee with perfect attendance was randomly selected to receive a cash prize or dinner out. The winner was Meghan Buckley, English and Fine Arts Teacher at QHS.

Bond Issue

It was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member Bailey to approve the Resolution providing for the issue of not to exceed \$21,585,000 general obligation school bonds of the District for the purpose of building and equipping five new elementary schools (Doc. Reg. No. 3000). On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Treasurer's Bond

It was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member Whitfield to approve the Treasurer's Bond covering Bond issue (Doc. Reg. No. 3001). On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Abatement from Working Cash to Education Fund

It was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member Whitfield to approve the Resolution Abating \$439,260.89 from the Working Cash Fund to the Education Fund (Doc. Reg. No. 3002). On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Hazardous Busing Route

It was moved by Member Bailey and seconded by Member Nichols to approve the Hazard Busing Routes for Rooney, Iles and Rooney School Sites. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Tentative Amended 2017-2018 Quincy Area Vocational Technical Center Budget

It was moved by Member Bailey and seconded by Member Troup to approve the Resolution on Presentation of Tentative Amended 2017-2018 Quincy Area Vocational Technical Center Budget and set hearing date as June 27, 2018 (Doc. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Tentative Amended West Central Region 2017-2018 Budget

It was moved by Member Bailey and seconded by Member Whitfield to approve the Resolution on Presentation of Tentative Amended 2017-2018 West Central Region Budget and set hearing date as June 27, 2018 (Doc. Reg. No. 3005). On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Tentative Amended 2017-2018 Special Education Association Budget

It was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member Bailey to approve the Resolution on Presentation of Tentative Amended 2017-2018 Special Education Association Budget and set hearing date as June 27, 2018 (Doc. Reg. No. 3006). On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Naming Harrison Street School/Quincy Junior High School Dedication

It was moved by Member Nichols and seconded by Member Troup to approve Sarah Atwater Denman as the name of the Harrison Street elementary school and rededicating the repairs and remodeling at Quincy Junior High School to the memory of Dr. Melinda Knapheide Germann. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Sarah Denman (1808—1882) founded and managed a hospital for the poor and those displaced as a result of the Civil War. She contributed her private library and her own funds to help create the Quincy Public Library. Ms. Denman also fought hard for a universal right to vote in the United States and personally collected signatures and submitted a petition to the Illinois State Constitutional Convention in 1870. She founded an organization to foster post-high school learning for young women in Quincy. Ms. Denman exemplifies the objectives of the Board and naming committee for naming the schools in that she is historically significant to Quincy, the State and the nation and is a role model and inspiration to students and education.

Upon completion of the extensive repair and remodeling, an appropriate display of Dr. Melinda Knapheide Germann's image and historical artifacts will be permanently displayed at Quincy Junior High School. She, too, is historically significant to Quincy. Dr. Germann (1862—1952) was the daughter of Mr. Harold Knapheide, entrepreneur and founder of Knapheide Corporation. Dr. Germann practiced medicine for over 35 years, was a teacher and continued that profession for Quincy's nurses and doctors throughout her long career. She sponsored and encouraged many young women and men to follow in her path. She was the first woman elected to the Quincy School Board and the Adams County Board of Supervisors. Part of her Board responsibility was to build the first modern Quincy High School which is the current Quincy Junior High School. President Ali thanked Joye Anderson for her extensive research on Dr. Germann.

Increase of Union/Non-Union Staff Members

It was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member Ali to approve 2% increase for Union and Non-Union staff members (Doc. Reg. No. 3007). On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

SAMHSA Project Aware Grant and EIR Mid-Phase Grant Proposal

It was moved by Member Bailey and seconded by Member Troup to approve submission of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) grant for funding to continue to provide Mental Health First Aid Training and the Education Innovation and Research Mid-Phase Grant Proposal with Midwest PBIS. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Executive Session

At 7:35 p.m., it was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member Bailey that the Board suspend the rules and go into executive session to discuss: a) the appointment, employment, compensation, discipline, performance, or dismissal of specific employees of the School District; b) collective negotiating matters between the School District and its employees or their representatives, or deliberations concerning salary schedules for one or more classes of employees; g) student disciplinary cases; i) pending, probable, or imminent litigation; and j) attorney/client privilege. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Resumption of Rules

It was moved by Member Troup and seconded by Member McNay to resume the conduct of the regular meeting under rules. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, McNay, Rose, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following member voted Nay: None; and the following members were absent Members Bailey and Nichols. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Student Discipline

It was moved by Member Bailey and seconded by Member Troup to adopt the recommendation made in executive session regarding pre-expulsion agreements for one QHS student. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.

Personnel Addendum

It was moved by Member Nichols and seconded by Member Bailey to approve the Revised Personnel Addendum as Amended. On the call of the roll, the following members voted Aye: Members Ali, Bailey, Nichols, Troup, and Whitfield; and the following Members were absent: Members McNay and Rose. Whereupon the President declared the motion carried.
