

Remote Learning

What is In Remote Learning: Remote learning occurs when students and teachers are separated physically.

Time Commitment from Family for Remote Learning:

Minimum of 2 – 2.5 hours for Head Start, PreK, & Special Education

Transitional Kindergarten 5 hours

Goal:

- Help students recover unfinished learning from spring 2020
- Support the development of instructional practices
- Ensure that each and every student continues to grow personally, academically and socially and emotionally.
- Keep students, families, and staff safe and supported while meeting Social and Emotional and Academic needs

Use platform chosen by ECFC to view and submit work if you have technology available. If you do not have technology available, you will receive paper lesson plans to implement learning activities with your child. Then work will be returned to school weekly.

Remote Learning Collaborative Responsibilities	
ECFC Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prepare for transition to remote learning should it be implemented • Communicate with all families and stakeholders • Support teachers in planning and implementing
Teaching Staff Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Build relationship with student and family • Prepare for remote learning • Provide materials to complete learning activities • Be available to answer questions from families • Provide feedback on student performance • Communicate weekly with families regarding academics and social emotional well being • Asking families if they have questions or need help • Therapist to continue therapy remotely, not in person
Non -Teaching Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Conduct Wellness checks over the phone or Zoom • Deliver instructional materials to students if their family does not have transportation • Assist classroom teachers with educational and social emotional duties • Participate in remote classrooms to better assist students • Collaborate with classroom teacher(s) on content and delivery systems

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Student Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Review instructional videos provided• Complete learning tasks• Ask questions• Share your feelings
Family Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Families are essential in the home/school partnership that is necessary for your child to excel academically and socially,• Engage with your child when watching instructional videos or when implementing paper lesson plans• Talk with your children daily about their feelings and learning activities completed• Keep an established schedule and routines as much as possible• Share with your child's teacher work samples and how your child is doing• Submit weekly assignments to school or on the technology platform• Ask the school for support as needed• Read books, tell stories, and play games with your children
