

QUINCY SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL
2022 SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM
Monday, June 6th through Friday, July 1st

It is time to plan summer school 2022. Please note dates, times, and attendance requirements for each program.

PURPOSE OF SUMMER SCHOOL: Summer school is designed to provide students with opportunities to recover credit in the core content areas (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies). By achieving mastery in the content and earning course credit, a student is more likely to remain on track for timely graduation. Students may also enroll in new courses for a first attempt in summer school for the purpose of acceleration.

POLICIES: Policies prescribed by the Board of Education for the administration and operation of Quincy Public Schools will be followed. Established policies with respect to school citizenship, attendance, punctuality, care of school property, and all academic requirements will be in effect. QHS will be following the same safety guidelines that were followed during the school year.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. Students are responsible to attend daily as scheduled. See below for program specific expectations.
2. Students in the summer session are present voluntarily and presumably because they need and want additional learning opportunities. Failure to observe established school policies and regulations may result in dismissal of the student. Disruptive behavior will not be tolerated.
3. The school cannot assume responsibility for the supervision of students except during the actual time in which they are assigned to a class and are in attendance. Students are permitted in the school only during their scheduled program or class time.
4. School insurance, purchased during the regular school year, does **NOT** cover the student in summer session unless he/she has the year-round policy coverage. Check your insurance coverage.
5. Credit will be awarded upon the successful completion of the course requirements. Grades recorded for summer school will become a part of the student's permanent record and the grade will be used in averaging grades for class rank.
6. Summer school grades count as part of 2021-2022 second semester for athletic eligibility.
7. Breakfast and lunch will be available through the district summer lunch program.

SUMMER PROGRAMS:

Academic Classes: Students should complete the summer school registration form, pay applicable fees, and attend school on Monday, June 6th at 8:00 a.m. to receive their schedule/course assignment. After the registration link is completed to take academic courses and payment is received, the next step is to gain access to QPS technology. Then the student is to attend QHS on Monday, June 6th at 8:00 a.m. to receive their schedule.

Driver's Ed. Classroom: Meets at Quincy Senior High School in room D135. Students must be 15 years old **on or before July 7, 2022** to enroll in Driver's Ed. Summer Class. The cost for Driver's Ed. Classroom is \$65.00; free/reduced lunch rates available for those who qualify. Two sessions are offered on the form; however, the later time will be canceled if we do not have enough students register for driver's ed. classroom.

Driver's Ed. BTW: Two sessions are offered and students will be assigned to a 1-hour time slot between 7:00a.m. - 2:00p.m.

Session 1: June 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 21, 22, 23, 24, and July 5, 6, 7, 8, 18, and 19.

Session 2: June 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 27, 28, 29, 30, and July 1, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15.

DRIVER'S EDUCATION: (in-district residents only)

To be eligible for driver's education courses, a student must have passed a minimum of eight courses in the previous two semesters. Eligibility will be verified as registration is processed.

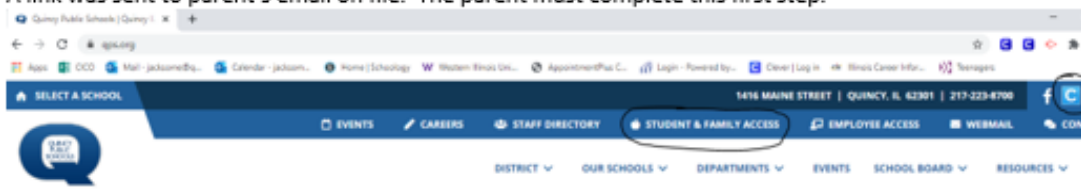
Classroom Driver's Education (June 6th through July 7th): Students who will be fifteen years of age on or before July 7th, 2021 and were enrolled in the 9th through 12th grade during the 2020-21 school year are eligible to take the course. Classroom meets in 1 ½ hour time slots (see registration form to indicate choices). The instructional fee is \$65.00 and must be paid at the time of registration. Behind-the-Wheel: The BTW application must be completed and submitted, accounts must be paid in full, including the \$250 BTW fee and any other outstanding fees to be officially registered. Free/reduced lunch rates are applicable. The deadline to register for summer school Behind-the-Wheel is May 19, 2022.

Accessing Technology:

Steps to access QHS Technology Programs for non-QPS students:

1. A link was sent to parent's email on file. The parent must complete this first step.



2. Click on Student & Family Access
3. Login – parent first name.parent last name (example: mindy.jackson)
Password – student QPS ID#
You will be prompted to choose a new password, then return to the login screen.
Enter the login and your new password.
4. Open Family Forms
Click Online Forms
5. Complete Technology Acceptable Use Policy questions/signatures.
6. Refresh and you should be able to access Edgenuity using the steps below.

Steps to log into Edgenuity:

1. www.qps.org
2. Click on the blue square with a C at the top right side of the webpage:

3. Login using your district login and password.
 - a. If you are a QHS student, use the same login and password as during the school year. (StudentID@my.qps.org)
 - b. If you are not a QHS student, your login is your QHS ID# (QHS-ID@my.qps.org) and your initial password is your firstnamelastname (all lower case). You will be prompted to change your password during your initial login.



4. Click on Edgenuity:
5. Begin classwork.
6. If you have trouble, contact QPS Technology at 217-228-7179. Leave a message with your name and phone number if you reach their voicemail.

Students will not be able to work on their Edgenuity course prior to attending in person. After attending summer school and gaining access to the Edgenuity course, students may work on their lessons and quizzes anywhere the internet is available. Students are required to take notes on the lessons and bring their notes to school when taking a test. Tests are required to be taken in person with the assigned teacher at QHS.
