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At Quincy Junior High School, we strive to ensure that all our students achieve academic success. QJHS has implemented a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) to ensure supports are provided to help students who may need extra help. Our data decision rule for academics is two or more failing grades at the end of the quarter. If your child earns two or more failing grades in core classes, he/she will receive an academic warning letter. This letter will prompt a Tier 2 intervention be put in place for your child. If the progress does not improve, your child may be enrolled in Summer School and/or retained the following school year.

Technology

Entering & Exiting the Building

QJHS will open its doors beginning at 7:25 a.m.

Bus riders will enter the front of QJHS off 14th Street and either go directly to breakfast or directly to their lockers on their own floor. Students will not be allowed to walk around on other floors that are not corresponding to their grade level.

Walkers, car riders, and bike riders may enter the building through two entrances:

- The northeast door (closest to 14th Street) off Maine Street, or
- The southwest door (closest to the Gym doors) off Jersey Street

When dropping students off, please pull up as far as possible and be prepared to drop off your child. We do not want to keep other parents who are dropping off waiting.

Students may exit the building from any exit. If you are picking your child up from school, please have a spot in which you pick up your child prearranged with him or her. Students may be picked up along Maine, in the Board Office Parking Lot (east of the school) or nearby. Jersey Street will be unavailable as busses use this street for pickup in the afternoon.

Please ask your child to only cross at crosswalks. If you are picking up on the opposite side of Maine Street, please do not allow your child to run through traffic. The safety and security of our students is our number one priority.



QJHS Attendance & Tardy Policies

ATTENDANCE POLICY FOR QJHS

Attendance in all classes is critical for successful learning and is the responsibility of students and their parents. Certain absences are unavoidable and will be considered excused. They are:

- Illness of the student
- Health or safety concerns
- Serious illness in the family
- Death in the family
- Family emergency
- Absences previously arranged by parents
- Observance of a religious holiday
- Military Obligations for the family/student

It is the responsibility of the parent to notify the Attendance Office by phone (217-228-7130) on the day of the absence or send a note upon the student's return. In the event the Attendance Office is not notified by a parent, contact will be pursued. If contact is unsuccessful, the absence will be considered unexcused/truant, and the parent will have three days following the absence to clarify the situation. All absences are recorded as excused or unexcused.

Parents should expect to be notified daily, by phone or by mail, when students are absent. After 9 absences, an absence due to illness will be excused only if the school receives a doctor's note confirming the illness. Parents will be required to attend a conference when teachers or staff believe the student's absences interfere with success at school. Again, our purpose is to limit the effects absences have on school success, not to punish those who are already dealing with difficult situations. Should your student have a health concern or other problem that interferes with regular attendance, please contact a counselor or school official.

TARDY POLICY FOR QJHS

Being on time to school and to each class is very important. Students who are habitually tardy to school and/or to class are not only missing valuable educational opportunities but may also be interrupting the learning of others upon their late arrival.

School begins promptly at 7:45 a.m. Students should be in their classrooms and ready to learn by the time the bell rings to begin the day and to begin each class hour throughout the day. Students who are late to class will be counted tardy. Teachers and staff will problem solve with students when they arrive late to class. If the tardiness becomes a habitual issue, teachers will call home and assign consequences.



Cell Phone and Earbud Policy

The use of **electronic devices** and other technology at school is a privilege. Students are prohibited from using electronic devices, except as provided herein. An electronic device includes, but is not limited to, the following: cell phone, video recording device, personal digital assistant (PDA), iPod®, iPad®, laptop computer, tablet computer, pager, or another electronic device.

During instructional time, electronic devices must be kept silenced and out-of-sight unless:

- A. Permission is granted by an administrator, teacher, or school staff member.
- B. Use of the device is provided in a student's individualized education plan (IEP) or 504 plan.

Electronic devices may never be used in any manner that disrupts the educational environment, violates student conduct rules, or violates the rights of others. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- 1. Using the device in locker rooms or bathrooms.
- 2. Using the device to cheat or send answers.
- 4. Creating, sending, sharing, viewing, receiving, or possessing an indecent visual depiction of oneself or another person using a personal electronic device.

In the event of an emergency, students may ask permission to use the school phones located in the Attendance Office to contact a parent/guardian. To help protect the instructional environment, parents are also asked to relay messages via the Attendance Office rather than calling or text messaging their child during school hours (7:30 am — 2:41 pm).

Earbuds or AirPods® are prohibited in the hallways and in classrooms unless they are being utilized for instructional purposes. In such instances,

- A. Permission must be granted by an administrator, teacher, or school staff member.
- B. Use of the earbuds and/or AirPods® is provided in a student's individualized education plan (IEP) or 504 plan.

When found in violation and asked to turn over the electronic device/cell phone or earbuds/AirPods®, the student will comply without incident. If refusal or insubordination ensues, students will be asked to turn in their device to the Attendance Office where they can pick it up at the end of the day. If the device is turned in a second time, a parent or guardian must pick it up. If the device continually becomes a problem, the student may be asked to turn it in before school daily or to keep it at home.

The school and school district are not responsible for the loss, theft, or damage to any electronic device or earbuds/AirPods® brought to school.

Students who use social media or other technology to bully or harass students which causes a disruption to the learning environment may be disciplined by the school. Please discuss appropriate uses of cell phones and social media with your child.



Dress Code

It is the basic responsibility of students to dress in an appropriate way for school. Modesty and neatness are expected. The following are prohibited:

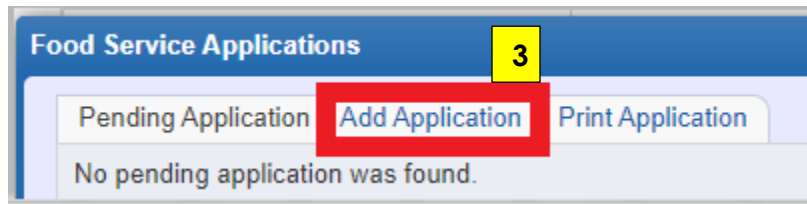
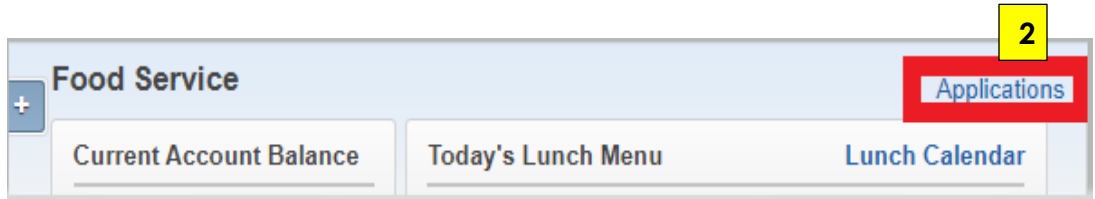
- Hats of any kind
- Hoods from a hoodie or jacket
- Non-prescription sunglasses (indoors)
- Slippers
- Clothing with vulgar language or the advertisement of any alcohol, drugs, tobacco, or acts of violence (including gender, ethnicity, religion, political views, sexual orientation)
- Ripped shirts
- Pants with holes that are extremely revealing
- Short/Revealing shorts
- Shirts that show any midriff or cleavage
- Spaghetti straps
- Off-the-shoulder shirts
- Winter coats in the classroom
- Shown undergarments (all bra straps, underwear, boxers, etc. need to be covered)
- Pajama pants
- Sleeveless undershirts or enlarged sleeve tank tops
- Chains, spiked collars or cuffs, and other jewelry that could potentially be hazardous to others

If students violate the dress code, they may be offered something different to wear. If that is not possible, parents should expect to bring appropriate clothing to school or take the student home to change.



Breakfast/Lunch
