## FROM SUPERINTENDENT PETTIT-BOARD MEETING REVIEW

The Board presented the Legend Award to the family of the late Paul Koscielski and to retired Rooney Principal Melanie Schrand for their impact in education and the legacy of Blue Devil spirit and pride they've created.

- Paul Koscielski began as a physical education and health teacher at Quincy Junior High School in 1969. He transferred his teaching responsibilities to Quincy Senior High School in 1973, where he was also Dean of Students.
   Paul coached wrestling, girls golf, and varsity football. He then served as principal of Baldwin West, Adams School and OHS.
- Melanie Schrand started her career in 1988 as a 6th grade teacher at Baldwin and then from 1989 to 2004 she
  was a 5th grade teacher. She became principal of Baldwin West in 2004. She was there until she was named
  principal of Rooney in June 2018. She retired in June 2022. Mrs. Schrand's priority was always her students and
  fellow educators. She was constantly working to make their job easier, celebrate their successes and create a
  welcoming learning environment.
