SUPER'S 8 DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. QHS pommers, cheerleaders, band and football teams were featured on the Today Show's Friday Morning Lights segment. Today Show staffers shared how impressed they were with how smoothly the event went.
- Students from Rooney are sorting into houses this week. Already in place at Denman and Iles and in the planning stages at Lincoln-Douglas and Baldwin, the Ron Clark Academy house system encourages community and camaraderie amongst students from different grade-levels and classes.
